FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT 'B'

First Reading: (Jer 31:31-34) Jeremiah tells a shattered people that God has not forsaken them, but will soon make a new covenant with them. This time God will write his law, not on tablets of stone, but in the hearts of his people. Their past sins will be forgiven and forgotten. This new covenant was brought about through the death of Jesus: 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood' (Lk 22:20).

Second Reading: (Heb 5:7-9) Here we catch an echo of the passion; we have the agonised prayer of Jesus and also his obedience to the Father: 'He learned to obey through suffering.' The reading also stresses the fruitfulness of Jesus' death: he became the source of eternal life for all who obey him.

Gospel Reading: (In 12:20-33) In John's Gospel Jesus often speaks of his 'hour'. The hour is the culmination of his mission, and it is also the condemnation of 'this world' and its ruler. Now the 'hour' (of his passion and death) has finally come. On the one hand he fears it—we see the very real disquiet with which he approaches it. But he also longs for it, for he is sure that in this hour of crisis and suffering the Father will glorify him. In John's Gospel Jesus does not pray to be delivered from the hour of trail and death (as he does in the Gospels), for the hour is the whole purpose of his life. He uses the example of a grain of wheat dying in order to yield a harvest, thereby suggesting that his death will bear much fruit: when he is lifted up on the cross he will draw all people to himself. ('All' means Jews and Gentile, which of course includes the Greeks who have come asking to see him). The lesson of the seed holds true also for his followers. They must not cling to their lives but be ready to give them up in the service of God. If they do, then they too will be glorified by the Father. Jesus is not telling us that we must 'hate' ourselves or our lives. Following Christ does not preclude a healthy love of self. John has no account of the agony in the garden in his gospel. The nearest he gets to it is when he reports Jesus as saying, 'My soul is troubled.' This sounds very similar to 'My soul is sorrowful even unto death' (Mk 14:34). And in the words, 'Should I ask the Father to save me from this hour?' we catch an unmistakable echo of his prayer in Gethsemane (Mk 14:36). In spite of his disquiet, Jesus' attitude is one of humble obedience to the Father. What are we to make of the voice from heaven? It is to be noted that the voice of God came to Jesus at all the great moments in his life. It came at his baptism. It came at his transfiguration. Now it comes when he is facing the ordeal of the cross. It indicates the closeness of his relationship with the Father and how the Father approves of what he i
